Dear friends and supporters.

This is to report concerning the trip I made with Trygve Jansen to Mexico, Principally to visit the home MAMA PAULITA in Mante. Mexico.

Our first stop was in Mexico City where we met Paul Godshall who has been a Men-



nonite missionary in Mexico for many years. He is very concerned about the children's home MARIA LUISA in the city of Serdan. This city is about 150 miles from Mexico City. Land has beer purchased and plans are being made to build a residence for the children there. At the preser they are renting an inadequate building where th children reside. There are 17 children in the home and many more need to come in. A local der tist and a physician are giving help when needed

We went from Mexico City to Mante and spent 21 days visiting the home MAMA PAULITA. This is a very fine home, with a boys' dormitory and a girls' dormitory. There are now 52 children in this home. Mrs. Celia Hernandez is the executiv secretary for the Mexican Board. She is the sign ter of Matilde Ruiz, founder of the home.

This visit was most inspiring. The children are happy and very well-behaved. They are bein raised in Christian love and teaching.

Meals are served at tables of six to ten children. Before the meals the children sing a song and then one of them lead in prayer. As soon as the meal is finished one person at each table brings the dishes into the kitchen and then wipes off the table. Groups of children take turn washing the dishes and cleaning the kitchen.

The children help keep all the rooms swept and dusted. There is much work to be done outside also. Some of the boys work many hours watering the trees and plants, putting away waste and keeping the grounds neat.

It was an experience of great value to me to visit this home, and it inspired me to let others know about this work. It was wonderful to see and meet these happy, friendly and loving children. They truly are being taught the Christian faith, and that is what makes it such a good home. These children come from broken homes, and some have been deserted by either father or mother or both; or other circumstances have caused them to be admitted to the home. Some of them could have died

Periodically we have had some young women go to Mexico to serve as volunteers at the home MAMA PAULITA. They were about four to six months. They were of great help and both the child ren and the staff were grateful for the help they gave, and they still think of them and remember them with fondness.

A volunteer from Norway, ASTRID WEKTERUD, a teacher, has contacted us and she offers her services for a whole year. She has applied for leave of absence from her teaching position for one year, and will be starting this Fall. She introduces herself in her letter below:

Dear friends and readers,

It is with a peculiar and strange feeling I'm sitting here in the cold winter Norway contemplating that in a few months I will be living in an entirely different country and in a semi-tropical climate in Mexico.

Telling something about my background it immediately comes to my mind what happened a few months ago and in recent months and how God has prepared my way to go to Mexico to serve. Every step has worked out so beautifully, and I feel at ease and confident that this is a link in God's plan for me.

Before I knew anything about the work in Mexico I felt God's call, - but to what? I was uncertain. Then last Fall he gave me this concrete task. The secretary of "Mexico-AKSJONEN" in Norway (branch of Layman ACTION) Anny Sveen, a dear friend of mine, made me aware of this work, and gave me the challenge to go to Mexico to help the needy children at the orphanage MAMA PAULITA. It was as if the various parts of a puzzle fell into place. Both Anny and I felt confident that God had spoken, and as time progresses it has become more and more clear.

A few data about myself. I was born and grew up in the community of Gran, Hadeland in Norway. After middel school I attended a folk high school in Gjøvik, then on to teachers' college for four years. I began my career as a teacher in the most northern county of Norway, Finnmark in 1969, and since that time taught several places in Norway before I finally settled in Mjøndalen (near Oslo) four years ago. I also attended a one year graduate course in Kristiansand.

The faith in Jesus Christ I received in my childhood home and have treasured it ever since. I have participated in Sunday school work, youth groups and Bible groups. This has meant a great deal to me personally.


