News from the Homes

Mano and Cinco Banderas Student Homes in Monterrey

The girls at Mano and the boys at Cinco Banderas are anxiously waiting for the Christmas break. The students that have family in many different parts of Mexico receive money to travel home by bus. The Houseparents also get a break from all their responsibilities. A few students prefer to stay and do the home chores, but they are often invited out to the homes of Christian friends from different churches.

We received a letter from a young woman who wanted to live at the Mano Home. She is 17 years old and has a burning desire to become a Medical Doctor to help the poor. Her name is Merari and she comes from a family with eight girls. Her parents are missionaries to people in the area of Tuxpan on the Mexican gulf. The girls often traveled with their parents and learned a life of trusting God for everything.

The director of the Mano home told us about Merari. Her prayers and hard work resulted in excellent college preparation grades. Her parents could not help her. She needed \$1400 for enrollment at a Monterrey University. Caring Action for Children does not have that much money in the budget for individuals, but through God's will, we were able to arrange a private donation for Merari. She is now on the road to become a doctor.

Caring Action supports the operation of these two student homes which could hold up to 45 young persons from poor backgrounds. Right now we are supporting 29 at \$22 per month per person.

The Shelter for Very Young Children in Monterrey, NL.



The Shelter is filled to capacity with 38 youngsters, now from the ages of one to about ten years old. The picture shows some of these well cared for children.

It is very satisfying to receive financial reports which show that six Mexican donor firms are supporting regularly. They will gradually make up for planned reduction by Caring Action.

The children, under supervision of volunteer Mexicans, excel in their school work. The Lord is truly blessing the work we started eight years ago!

Esperanza Home for Children in Bonfil, near Cancun, Q.Roo

A work team of New York Methodists gave their time and material costs to paint the new Vocational Training Building. They enjoyed being with the children and giving them early Christmas presents. We have a report and a picture of a new boy at Esperanza. Here is what we know of him:



Jose is 7 years old. He came from the State of Chiapas, where civil war and violence is common. Apparently his mother had been violent and abused him severely because he was brought to the home by the welfare service by order of a judge. There is no mention of a father.

The welfare service does not pay anything for placing Jose or for the other 30 children. Your donations and those of caring Mexican individuals will give Jose an opportunity to celebrate a peaceful Christmas with many new friends.

Mama Paulita Home for Children in El Limon, Tamps.

The Mama Paulita Home operates a school for children Kindergarten through 3rd grade. Children from the El Limon community also attend.

The school is on the Children's Home property and has been in operation for almost 20 years.



Caring Action has one young man right now, Rodney, volunteering to give his time and talents for the children at Mama Paulita. He comes from the "Bruderhof" organization in Pennsylvania, which sponsored three young ladies for one year of service in past years. 
