
Our 40th year in Mexico



## La Familia Home for Children Serdan, Puebla


We have had some changes at La Familia:


# Mama Paulita Home for Children






## **MANO Home for Young Women in Monterrey**

A letter from Directors Henry and Karla Brown tells the story of two young ladies that came to the Home strictly on faith. Betty and Christina both came from the State of Vera Cruz, 12 hours away by bus. Both were from humble and Indigenous families that exist in precarious conditions. The girls had saved some money for travel by selling produce on the streets.

The girls came with an ambition to help their people with access to medical care and better nutrition knowledge. This would require them to enroll in a University Program. They had no money, but by faith,
