



A letter from Carmen, a former resident and now Board Member

I was 20 years old when I decided to leave my family and native state of Veracruz. I left without a sure place to live, and without knowing any opportunities for a better life. I wanted to travel and took a 16 hour bus ride to the city of Victoria. I stayed there for three months. Then a niece told me to contact a missionary named Cory, about four hours away in Monterrey. I did and she invited me

She took in young ladies to improve their future, not only with careers but also with spiritual lives. The Home for young lady Students, called MANO, was started in 1990. It offered a me a place to live, schooling, a loving family, and a great support in all aspects of my new life. A GREAT BLESSING!

The house was in a very poor and humble district of the city—not considered safe for young ladies but it had much heart-felt love. I could feel blessings and the presence of God! I met many young ladies that came to Cory and were blessed as much as I. Each one came with a different history and difficult background.

Soon the rented two bedroom storefront house had insufficient space as many more were taken in. So by faith, all of us started special petitions to God for a bigger place. We prayed at every opportunity- at meals, in the church and before going to sleep in our crowded quarters.

A lot of time passed before God answered. He sent us friends from Caring Action for Children which later donated a new modern House.. This home had a kitchen, living room and four bedrooms! We gave God our thanks for giving much more than what we prayed for!

I only wanted to help Cory with running the home for almost 20 lost girls. But Cory insisted that I also should study for a technical career. I chose one in Tourism to honor Cory who said she never had an opportunity to study in her lifetime. I thank God and Caring Action supporters for the opportunities given me to prepare for a career and live in a Christian Home!

Some time later, Cory became ill. I saw how her body was wasting away, but I also saw her faith grow with a desire to live and continue working in her ministry. She taught us so many life lessons. The most important was that: **We should bless others as God is Blessing us**!. She died later, but she will always be alive in our memories!

For ten years I was part of the MANO Home. I no longer live there, but we who left, continue with Cory's vision. At this moment God has blessed me with my own home, and I serve on the governing board of MANO.


