Shelter for Young Children, Monterrey, NL.

The Shelter for Young Children fills a great need for children that are abandoned or orphaned in the city of Monterrey. The Director, Martha Rojas, has the vision and energy to create a place where children are not only fed, clothed and sent to school, but where they have opportunities to learn how to play musical instruments, learn sports, be tutored by volunteers, and provided an in-house library for studying, as well as a performing arts auditorium.

The library was added as a second story above one of the dormitories, and is used frequently by the children. The current project is to build an apartment so future houseparents can live on the property, opposite the library. As you walk up the steps, (see the picture to the left,) go to the right to enter the library, and go to the left to enter the apartment, still in construction.

Approximately 50 children ranging from birth to age 14 are currently living here. At any hour of the day, you can hear the happy voices of children running and playing —outside, in the playroom, in the music room and library, and in the sleeping rooms. It is a happy place! And the children are being taught through the love of those that care for them, as well as through daily devotions and weekly worship

Education in the Mountains of Southern Mexico

The Hogar Estudianil Indigena (HEI) Home, started in 2006, continues to grow and offer educational opportunities, as well as room and board, to the indigenous children living in remote mountain villages. The supporting board, headquartered in Puebla, continue to make improvements and expand the uses of their land to assist the Home in becoming more selfsufficient.

The philosophy of Caring Action for Children is to provide funds to start a Home and continue to give emotional and spiritual support during the early years, and gradually reduce the amount of financial support. With an education, students will have an opportunity to be fully integrated into Mexican society, and able to support themselves.

In 2008/2009 the local board and students began cultivating the land and now grow corn and other crops. In 2010 they initiated "The Chicken Project." Pictured above is the initial construction of the "Gallinero," (a chicken coop.) Funds from Caring Action donors have helped with construction and with the upcoming purchase of 100 egg-laying hens.

A number of years ago, a large financial gift from Norway purchased a van to transport children to their schools. The cost of needed maintenance and repairs was quite high last year. A local bus operator offered to provide the service at a reasonable cost. It is over 2 miles to the schools, and the students no longer have to walk to school with the van out of commission. The appreciate the extra time that can be spent for studying.
