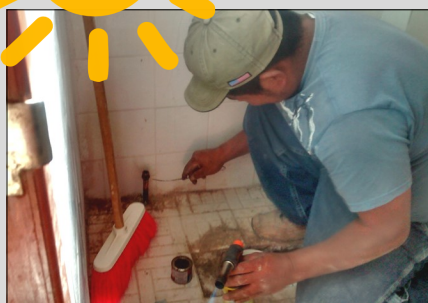
Blanca is quiet and shy, but has big dreams. She would like to be a chef and interior designer when she grows up. She also would like to learn to play the violin.

An Update From the Home for Indigenous Students in Tlaxiaco, Oaxaca



Repairs to the Home in Tlaxiaco, Oaxaca, were initiated three months ago starting with the repair of the leak in the second floor bathroom which was causing water damage to the walls of the building. Several walls with water damage have been repaired, including the garage.

When the students are not attending school or studying, they are busy preparing the soil for a new crop of corn—so necessary for their daily meals, with hopefully extra to sell to others.

Last month the local Board of Directors for the Home took a Presbyterian pastor along to visit the Home. She was impressed with the ministry to the teens and she plans on sending students from the seminary to visit the Home and share their faith. She will also send a chef to teach the students how to prepare bread, to run the bakery and obtain other resources for the project.
