May Jansen, the wife and partner of Caring Action's Executive Director Tor Jansen, passed away this in September. May partnered together with Tor in building up the non-profit organization—Caring Action for Children. Joining him in many trips

to Mexico, she worked with the houseparents, making sure that the children were well fed, cared for, and educated.

When work parties were put together to visit one of the Homes in Mexico, May was there also, coordinating meals for the volunteers and assisting them in the projects planned. The children loved "Tia May", and looked forward to her visits. Back home in the USA, May and Tor frequently visited churches, sharing the story of Caring Action and enlisting partners to help keep the Homes running.

In addition to her commitment to Caring Action for Children, May, together with Tor, raised and cared for 9 children (5 of whom were adopted.) One of their daughters is Mia Varone, the Treasurer for Caring Action for Children. Mia's son Josh Varone is also on the Board of Directors, continuing the family's compassion and commitment for the children in Mexico.

May showed what it was to live a Christian life, always willing to lend a helping hand. She will be greatly missed by all who had the privilege of knowing her.



Martha Rojas, the founding director of *The Shelter* in Monterrey since its inception in 1996, passed away in July of this year. Martha, together with a group of fellow nurses, dreamed of starting a place where unwed and homeless mothers and their babies could live and receive medical support. (It has since changed to welcome children of all ages.)

With a large grant obtained by Caring Action for Children's support team in Sweden, the Home opened on July 1, 1996.

Martha coordinated the project and became the Director of the program when it opened, and was the driving force in making the place such a wonderful home for the 50 children that live there. She found major supporters in Mexico to help fund further buildings for dormitories, classrooms, an auditorium, a library, and an apartment for houseparents. Under her leadership, the children have access to doctor and nurse well-checks, psychologists, and tutors from the local universities to assist with their studies. She partnered with Back 2 Back, a volunteer organization, who provided labor and assistance in growing the campus.

Martha retired as Director of the Shelter in 2019. something that was difficult for her to do, as she poured her life into making the Home a place where children could thrive, learn, and know they are loved by God. Martha, you achieved that goal.
